

ORDER

The matter is before the Court on a motion by the government for a protective order, pursuant to Rule 16(d)(1), Fed. R. Crim. P., relating to certain documents that have been filed by the government ex parte for in camera review by the Court pursuant to the request for a protective order.

There appearing good cause to do so, it is hereby **ORDERED** that the following documents be filed in this matter ex parte and in camera, for review solely by the Court:

1. Motion of Government to Permit Ex Parte and In Camera Filing; and
2. Government's Motion for Protective Order and attached documents.

It is further **ORDERED** that the government disclose to counsel for the defendant the following information concerning each of the documents submitted for in camera review:

1. the name and position of the author(s) and addressee(s);
2. the name and position of any individuals who received a copy of the document;
3. the date of the document; and
4. the basis for the objection to production of the document.

No disclosure need be made of the contents or subject matter of the documents.

It is further **ORDERED** that should defendant, by counsel, choose to move to compel production of these documents, a portion of defendant's discovery submission, due on Friday, March

15, 2002, may be devoted to the principles defendant believes should be dispositive of the Court's in camera review of these documents.

It is further **ORDERED** that the Court will hear oral argument, if necessary, and rule on this matter at the discovery hearing now scheduled for 10:00 a.m., Monday, April 1, 2002.

The Clerk is directed to send a copy of this Order to all counsel of record.
