<u>ORDER</u>

The matter is before the Court on the government's (i) motion for permission to make (supplemental) ex parte in camera filings, (ii) supplemental ex parte in camera filing and (iii) motion for modification of Court's March 4, 2002 Order.

There appearing good cause to do so, it is hereby **ORDERED** that the following documents be filed in this matter <u>ex parte</u> and in camera, for review solely by the Court:

- 1. Motion for Permission to Make (supplemental) Ex Parte In Camera Filings;
- 2. Supplemental Ex Parte In Camera Filing, with attachments; and
- 3. Motion for Modification of Court's March 4, 2002 Order, with attachments.

Because the reasons provided by the government in support of the motion for modification are unpersuasive, it is hereby **ORDERED** that the motion for modification of the Court's March 4, 2002 Order is **DENIED**.

There appearing good cause to do so, it is further **ORDERED** that the additional documents identified in the government's supplemental <u>ex parte</u> in camera filing are subject to the disclosure requirements set forth in the March 4, 2002 Order. Should defendant choose to move to compel production of these additional documents, a portion of defendant's discovery submission, due on Friday, March 15, 2002, may be devoted to the principles defendant believes should be dispositive

of the Court's in camera review of these documents.

It is further **ORDERED** that the Court will hear oral argument, if necessary, and rule on this matter at the discovery hearing now scheduled for 10:00 a.m., Monday, April 1, 2002.

The Clerk is directed to send a copy of this Order to all counsel of record.
