

**ORDER**

The matter is before the Court on the Government's Motion to Permit *Ex Parte* and *In Camera* Filing of Government's *Ex Parte* Motion for Protective Order Regarding Thirteen Non-Exculpatory Reports of Detainee Interviews.

For good cause shown, and for the reasons stated in the April 17, 2002 Order granting the Government's Motion to Permit *Ex Parte* and *In Camera* Filing of Attachment A to the Government's Motion for Protective Order Regarding Detainee Interview Reports,<sup>1</sup> it is hereby **ORDERED** that the Government's Motion to Permit *Ex Parte* and *In Camera* Filing of Government's *Ex Parte* Motion for Protective Order Regarding Thirteen Non-Exculpatory Reports of Detainee Interviews is **GRANTED**.

Accordingly, because there is good cause to do so, it is **ORDERED** that the Government's *Ex Parte* Motion for Protective Order Regarding Thirteen Non-Exculpatory Reports of Detainee Interviews is hereby **FILED** *ex parte*, solely for *in camera* review.

The *Ex Parte* Motion for Protective Order Regarding Thirteen Non-Exculpatory Reports of Detainee Interviews is currently under advisement and will be decided promptly, without oral
